**The Congregation's Financial Stewardship,
2008 Summary of Accounts – Receipts/Expenses**

Dear Friends in Christ,

Year of 2008

How does one summarize and celebrate an entire year of ministry into one narrative? It's the challenge, opportunity, and call from God to every leader at Christ Church – every year. Last year's calendar is always a helpful tool to my memory, and I regularly use it to remind me how active we are at Christ Church. That will be the case again this year, but first I want to begin with some reflections on statements that I have heard or spoken throughout 2008:

“No one ever wants to come to Bible study.”

This year, as I pondered the ELCA's request to give the number of adults who participate in Bible study groups in this congregation, I expected a single-digit response. But you know what? There are 28 of you who study the Bible together regularly. Some of you are involved in adult Sunday School classes, and some of you participate in our Sunday evening and Thursday afternoon studies.

Yes—there is a lot of room for growth. And if you're not in Bible Study – you NEED that as a child of God! But...twenty-eight is a long way from zero. And what humble prayers of forgiveness I asked of the Lord as I was surprised by the number of people in our church family who gather to study God's Word.



“Our attendance is WAY down.”

I have wondered about this myself throughout the year. It has seemed that way. Yet when I added our attendance figures for worship services throughout 2008, I was again surprised. Yes – our average attendance IS down. Last year's average was 91. The year before that, it was 94. And the year before that, it was 93. Throughout that same time, we gained 34 members and lost 27 – for a net gain in membership of 7. This year, we gained 4 members and lost 10 members – for a net loss in membership of 6.

And for those of us who like mathematical problems solved – this means that for the past four years, Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church has gained 1 member.

Surprised? I was, too! And I really jumped back when our average attendance for 2008 amounted to 89 – just 2 people fewer in worship than 2007; and 5 people less than our highest average attendance in the past four years.

Humble prayers again, Lord....our attendance is quite active and much for which to give thanks.



And finally.... *“People just aren't giving enough. Our offerings are way down.”*

It is very true that our weekly offerings did not keep up with what we agreed when we established our budget for 2008. First of all, the budget is our pledge to God that we will provide the financial gifts to do God's work in our congregation, community, and world. Many of our leaders spend a great deal of time, talent, and perspiration determining what to recommend when we gather to consider our annual budget. All of us spend time deciding how much we can offer to the Lord in meeting this budget we pledge to our Lord each year. And if we don't meet it, we get discouraged; perhaps even angry. If you find yourself having been there at any time throughout this past year, know I have been there with you.

I decided, however, to look at this statement from a positive perspective, given all the blessed surprises God has given me in our Bible study and worship attendance.

So, I checked the average annual giving of our active membership from 2005 through 2007. These past reports on the ELCA website revealed an average giving of \$723.19 per year, per active member.

Our treasurer is still finalizing those figures for this year's report. However, in his report to Church Council as of Sunday, December 28, 2008, he reported that \$126,585.47 had been given by our membership for current operating expenses. No—that's not enough to meet the budget—and we do still need to grow in our giving.

But look at this: our active membership totals 172. If you divide our December 28 totals by 172, you get an average giving per active member of \$735.96.

In a year when our economy, our hearts, and our world realities have brought us much pain, Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church members have increased their 3-year average giving by \$13 per week.

And if I compare it to our last annual figures, that number has gone from \$686.18 to \$735.96 – a nearly \$50 per week increase per member.

More humble pie. More prayers for forgiveness. More prayers for helping us to continue to proclaim and live the vision God has given us.



You know, most pastors go “blah!” when it comes to talking about these kinds of statistics. The numbers don't tell the story. The growth in faith is what tells the story. I cannot tell you this exercise in statistical learning has been energizing for me at all!

But the growing that comes from these gifts is so very evident to me – and I beg your continued attention as I list just a few of those I have seen just this past year:

- Out of an average weekly worship attendance of 89, I see 62 of you throughout the week as well, beyond Sunday, Wednesday, or Saturday worship, volunteering and participating in various ministries of our congregation.
- Do you know how many people reach out to folks in our congregation who are in grief? - those quiet, behind the scenes folks who provide good food for those in the midst of deep loss? We will soon be recognizing in worship over 50 members of our church who help with this compassionate ministry.
 - We have two new leaders who will soon be authorized as lay worship leaders in the Upper Susquehanna Synod. Kellie Brouse and Ed Coup will complete their studies this spring, and at our synod assembly in June, will join Rose Bolich in this synod team of leaders.
 - Our ministry teams are growing and expanding with continued and new ministries.
 - Staff Support initiated a “thank you” ministry this year for our staff and lay leadership.
 - Christian Education gained new leadership in Pam Walsh and Nancy Mensch, who were instrumental in beginning a summer Sunday School for children and a “Bible Buddies” youth ministry for children younger than traditional youth group age.
 - Worship began the task of “all in one” bulletins and learning new liturgies found in Evangelical Lutheran Worship, our new ELCA worship book.
 - Property took on the abundant task of installing a new alarm system as well as completing the pavilion project. Our thanks to Roger Watts for his many hours attending to those tasks.
 - Social Ministry has re-organized and developed a plan for



carrying out its many ministries to our homebound, as well as congregation, community, and world needs. We have A LOT of projects going!

- Witness began a great discussion on how hospitable we are at Christ Church and developed a presentation for our congregation to ponder hospitality.
- Finance tackled our tough financial issues and worked to encourage our increased support of the budget. Theirs was a tough, tough task.
- Endowment began the blessed work of reaching out with those bequest monies that we designated for outreach and care of others. In the process, they have discovered some “glitches” in the guidelines and are faithfully working to recommend changes and corrections. Our thanks to Steph Byers for her many hours of leading this group in such a brand-new, complicated ministry!
- And Ron and Deb Snyder have taken on the ministry of missionary coordinators. Their work will be bringing information before us about our missionary, Pastor Ron Shellhamer, who serves in Liberia.

I could go on and on about the growing I see as pastor of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church! Yes, the growing can often get bogged down in the “not-so-great” thoughts. As people, we may have a tendency to look more at what we perceive needs to be fixed, rather than celebrated. Yet, as I approach the end of an old year and anticipate the ministries of a new year, I am hoping that together we can begin to look around the pain and see the blessing growing all around us.

God has been good to us! As we pray that prayer of thanksgiving together, may God lead us to continued, abundant, and wide-open opportunities to see the good that God is creating...as we live the mission God has given us at Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church:

“We are called by God to follow Christ’s example and teachings through worshipping, witnessing, learning, supporting one another, and reaching out to others.”

The design, development, and maintenance of the church website has been under my direction since October of 2005. The cost of hosting a website for our church is \$56 per year, which I continue to donate.

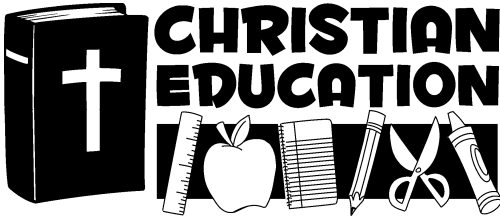
The website is updated each week with the church bulletin, weekly events, the pastor's sermon, the prayer page, photos, and other pertinent changes.

We ask you to please pray for all our ministry groups, and, if the spirit moves you, please don't hesitate to join us. All are welcome to participate in the Lord's ministry.

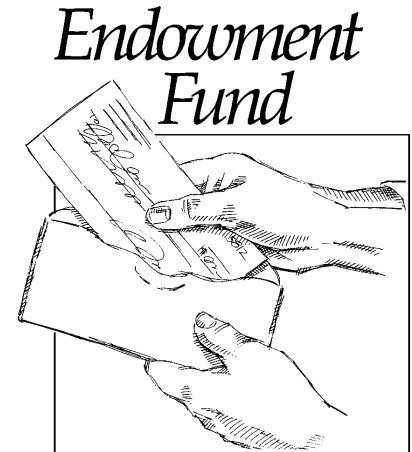

Endowment Committee

The new committee held its first meeting on Tuesday, March 25, 2008. Stephanie Byers was elected at the January Council meeting to serve as the appointed Council representative on this committee. A random drawing was held on March 25, 2008, to determine the length of term to be served by the newly elected congregational electees – Roger Watts (1-year term), Betty Morgan (2-year term), Ed Coup (3-year term). Our fifth committee member, Glenn Snyder, was appointed at the April Council meeting.



Requests reviewed in 2008 are as follows:

- #001 submitted 5/4/08 – Project Team Cambodia - \$2,500 approved on 6/3/08 – one time funding to be used strictly for the building, equipping and ongoing maintenance fees incurred for the operation of the Milton School in Cambodia
- #002 submitted 5/6/08 – “Celebration of Children” Knoebel’s tickets - \$400 approved on 6/3/08 – one time funding
- #003 submitted 6/11/08 – Camp Mt. Luther Scholarships - \$1,481.75 approved on 8/5/08 for five applicants, which was 75% of fees
- #004 submitted 6/9/08 – Matching funds for 2008 budget for 11 local benevolences - \$2,400 rejected on 7/2/08
- #005 submitted 7/10/08 – VBS 2008 mission project - \$200 approved on 8/5/08 – one time funding to support schools in Cuzco & Peru
- #006 submitted 9/16/08 – Congregational subscription to Lutheran Magazine - \$1,100 approved on 12/2/08 to be reviewed each year
- #007 submitted on 9/17/08 – Free Bread & Milk Sunday – up to \$500 approved on 11/4/08 – one time funding to hand out Free Bread/Milk Cards to be redeemed at Weis Markets, Milton, by January 20, 2009
- #008 submitted 9/29/08 – Christmas gift cards for needy families - \$1,050 approved 11/4/08 for 14 gift cards
- #009 submitted 9/29/08 – Christmas gift for Pastor Ron Shellhamer, missionary serving in Liberia - \$500 approved on 11/4/08
- #010 submitted 10/1/08 – Support Navajo Lutheran Mission school supplies - \$500 approved on 11/4/08 – one time funding
- #011 submitted 10/31/08 – 2205 Protégé Organ – application still under review

The financial documentation given to committee as of 11/12/08 has the Endowment Fund with a balance of \$188,110.29.

Report of the Congregational Council

The responsibility of the Congregational Council is the general oversight of the life and activities of the congregation. Leading the congregation in stating its mission, long-range planning, setting goals, and priorities are all part of this process. During 2008, Council:

- Participated in a Leadership Retreats on April 18 and August 5 along with other leaders of the church.
- Participated in the Annual Congregational Meeting on March 9, 2008, as well as additional congregational meetings on May 18, September 28, and November 16.
- Approved the finance committee's recommendation for the following persons for the newly formed Endowment Committee: Ed Coup, Betty Morgan, Glenn Snyder, and Roger Watts.
- Approved the purchase of two new roasters for the kitchen with money from the Kitchen Fund.
- Selected Synod Assembly voting members Rose Bolich with Kay Dunn as alternate; and Ed Coup with Stephen Moll as alternate.
- Supported Kay Dunn as Vacation Bible School Director as well as all other leaders and the activities of the week.
- Supported the youth group will help with the church yard sale on May 3, 2008.
- Supported the congregation approved pavilion project.
- Approved a donation of \$500 from current expenses donated to First Lutheran Church, Altoona, as a memorial gift in memory of Pastor Fred Romig.
- Approved property committee recommendation that the old sanctuary lights and ceiling fans be donated to HandUP Foundation.
- Supported a small committee of Penny Coup, Rose Deaner, Kathleen Burch, Laurie Fisher, and Donna Spear who worked to raise awareness to increase giving during the summer.
- Approved Unico Sealing, Inc. of Lewisburg for parking lot resealing.
- Supported the property committee in the installation of new sanctuary lights.
- Approved the ELCA's recommendation to supporting Pastor Ron Shellhamer in Liberia.
- Supported the congregation approved installation of the church fire and security system project.
- Supported the purchase of three new banners and new acolyte robes.
- Supported the Synod Reformation Service on October 26 at Christ Church.
- Provided a "simple" lunch of hotdogs cooked in the new pavilion following the November 16 congregational meeting.
- Council accepted the resignation of Judy Schneider due to health reasons.
- Council accepted Mike Lazor's resignation from Council as of May 31, 2009.

Congregational Meeting Minutes

The November 16, 2008, congregational meeting of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church was called to order to present, discuss, and vote on:

1. Constitutional change to the Nominating Committee procedure
2. Endowment Committee election
3. Church Council elections
4. 2009 Church Budget

Don Fisher reviewed the constitutional change concerning the Nominating Committee procedure. Each member had a copy to review. Don explained that this change actually brings the constitution wording to the actual nominating procedure which has been followed for several years. Today marks the first reading of this constitutional change. The actual change will be voted on at the March 2009 congregational meeting. There were no questions, comments, or discussion.

Don explained the Endowment Committee election. Roger Watts served one year and has now agreed to serve a full three years. Council recommends that we accept Roger to serve a three-year term on the Endowment Committee. Ed Coup seconded the recommendation. There were no other nominations from the floor. By voice, all in attendance were in agreement.

Council recommends that Kay Dunn, Mike Lazor, and Steven Moll serve a second three-year term on church council. Each has agreed to the second term. Nancy Walters seconded the recommendation. By voice, all in attendance were in agreement.

Don presented two 2009 budget possibilities from council: a maintenance budget which matches the expected 2008 income and expenses; and the mission budget which is the 2008 budget plus a \$5,000 increase which is undesignated. The maintenance budget would include no salary increases, no local benevolences, and reductions in current church programs. Council recommends the mission budget but needs commitment from the congregation in order to make this budget realistic. With the mission budget, an increase of \$20,000 from current giving, or 17%, will need to be realized.

Discussion ensued. Evelyn McConnell commented that voting yes to the mission budget is making a pledge to God to give of their talents. Penny Coup agreed that if we vote for the mission budget we must show commitment. One way is to enroll in the Simply Giving program which deducts your church offering from your paycheck. This ensures that you give to your church on a regular basis. Kathleen Burch shared concerns about the current financial situation and people with fixed incomes and families with children. Rose Bolich made reference to today's Gospel and sermon and feels that we need to vote for the mission budget. We cannot become complacent. We cannot rely on the wonderful gifts that we as a church have received from faithfully departed members. Rose continued by saying that we need to be responsible for our giving and this involves our faith. If we cease to do mission then our mission ceases to exist. Anna Mae Harpster asked for clarification about how the vote will proceed. Don explained that if we vote yes for the mission budget then we are done. However, we will need commitment. If we vote no for the mission budget then talk will resume. Rose Bolich seconded council's recommendation to pass the 2009 mission budget. By voice vote, the mission budget passed. Pastor Pat asked for a show of hands for the record. Thirty-five voted yes, eleven voted no.

The meeting adjourned.
