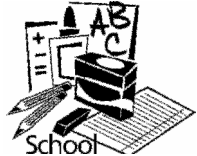

Church Council Notes December 5, 2006



- The meeting was opened with our Mission Statement and prayer.
- Minutes from the previous meeting were approved.
- The Treasurers report was approved.
- A recommendation from the Finance Committee to designate loose offerings in December are as follows: Dec. 3 – Missions, Dec. 10 – Camp Mt. Luther, Dec. 17 – Habitat for Humanity, Dec. 24 – Operation Bootstrap Africa, and Dec. 31 – Global Health Ministries. This was carried.
- A motion was made to use \$500 from the Leiby Trust to purchase 7 \$50 Weis Gift cards and \$50 in cash for 8 needy families in the area. This was carried.
- Part of the above motion was to use \$500 from the Leiby Trust to send a Christmas gift to our missionaries Jim and Karen Noss. This was carried.
- A recommendation was made from the Finance committee to use a **one-time distribution** in **2007** from the bequests to meet our Benevolence contributions which was dropped from the Budget for 2007, and a one-time contribution of \$10,000 to support ELCA outreach ministry programs. The total distribution for 2007 would be \$25,000. This was carried.
- Church council approved a request from Country Comfort Assisted Living to use the church building as an evacuation center in the event of an emergency. This was carried.



OFFERING
COUNTERS
NEEDED

Beginning in January 2007, the Sunday worship services' offerings need to be counted by **VOLUNTEER MEMBERS** of the congregation. This has been mandated by the 2006 audit committee and approved by the congregational council at its November 2006 meeting.

TWO counters are needed per Sunday and will be assigned on a monthly basis. However, if enough people volunteer, counters can be assigned on a weekly or bi-weekly basis.

The Offerings **MUST BE** counted immediately after each Sunday worship service. Arrangements to count the offerings at different times other than after services must be cleared with the church office previously.

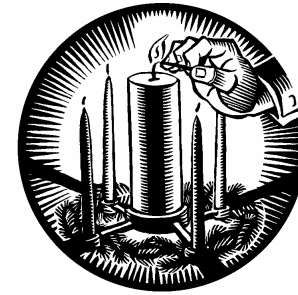
All volunteers will be trained and all supplies will be provided.

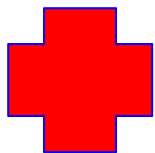

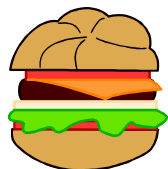

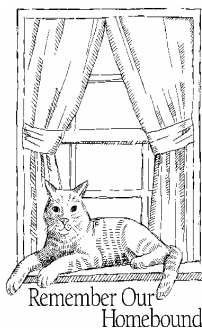

Blessings at Christmas,

This year has been full of mixed blessings and sorrows as we look back. Some of it is even a blur and maybe that is the part that we would like to forget somehow.

In Cameroon we were busy with many different projects besides the normal busy days – a lot of visitors coming and going; some coming for the dedication of the new burn and intensive care unit. While here some got the idea to build a neo-natal wing in the maternity; it was finished in June. Jim was responsible for overseeing the projects.

We returned to the United States and Karen had knee surgery. Before surgery, doctors wanted to try some injections called Supartz. Spaced out over 10 weeks Karen had 5 injections in the knee. With not much improvement, she had knee replaced. She remained in the United States while Jim returned to the Cameroon in mid-November.

While home in the summer they visited churches 24 times – one of which was here at Christ Lutheran in August.

They also had opportunity to meet new little grandson Ian Michael, born in May to Jean and Paul. In July daughter Lisa and husband Jeff and children came to MN to visit and also to see baptism of Ian.

Karen remained in the United States so knee could heal with no chance of blood clots. And to also continue with therapy. If anyone would like to contact Karen in Minnesota just to help encourage her in her recovery her phone number is 952-435-6964.

While preparing to travel to our summer missionary retreat Karen's aunt Alice died and a day or two later her newpew Bob died as well. Two weeks later Jim's unclde Luther died and the end of August Jim's Aunt Myrtle who worked 36 years in Cameroon had a very bad stroke and is now in a Nursing home and is paralyzed on her left side.
