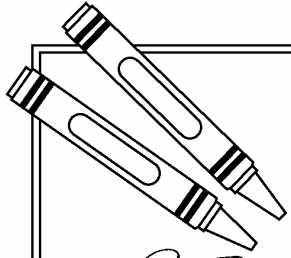

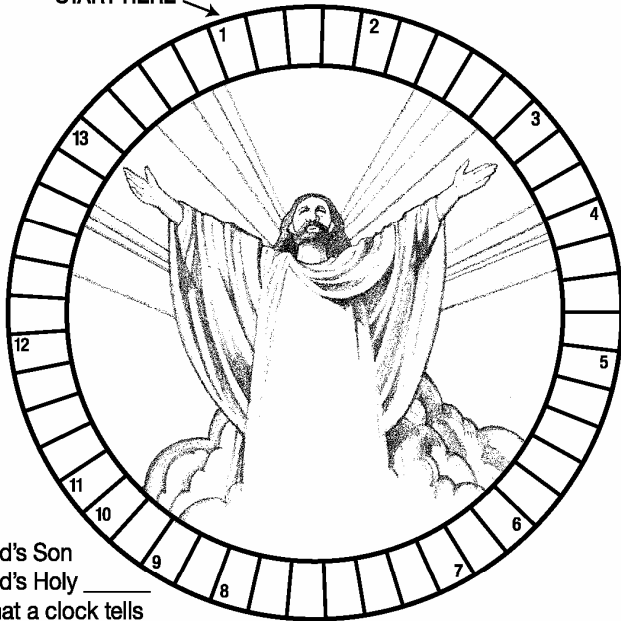

Dear Friends in Christ,

This has been another amazing month—in so many ways. I have the blessing of seeing our ministry together from many angles. There are a LOT of people doing a LOT of things around here! Please join me this month in praying thanks to God for these particular faith journeys:

- **Thank You** to our Property Team and our Finance Team - all of you! Our church experienced a break-in on Easter Eve, April 7. Those who serve our property and finance ministries have been outstanding in evaluating and restoring our losses, and connecting with our insurance agent, contractors, and law enforcement. **My special thanks** to Kellie Brouse, our Council President, who went into motion early on Easter morning to inform the necessary folks and follow through with the initial investigation so I could be with my family on Easter evening.

- We had minimal losses – mostly cash and minimal property damage. Those who broke in came through a window in the storage room and broke the locks of our offices. 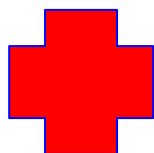

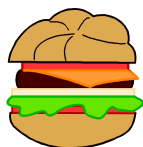

OUR FINANCES

At our congregational meeting last November the congregation adopted a bare bones budget of \$142,693 for 2007. "Bare bones" means the minimum amount that is needed to keep the church open. Our budget only includes staff salaries, utilities, and a small amount for our internal programs such as Christian Education and Worship and Music. There are no synod benevolences, no local benevolences, or no outreach to others included in this budget. If this budget is not met, we can't continue to operate as we have in the past.

Our Finance Ministry Group and Council did not like presenting a budget to the congregation that did not include any funds for outreach, but there were no other options. Just like in your own household, the congregation's expenses could not exceed our income. We all prayed that this would lead to increased giving. Unfortunately, that hasn't happened yet.

Through March 25 our average weekly giving for 2007 was \$2,479. This is \$265 per week below the \$2,744 weekly average that we need to meet our budget. Giving is at about the same level as last year despite efforts to encourage more giving in order to meet our budget. In addition, we have no benevolences in our 2007 budget, so we really need to increase giving to level that will once again support benevolences. Now is the time to confront this problem.

It can be difficult to understand how our individual giving fits into a budget of \$142,693. Big numbers can be scary, especially when the number is real money. Our average weekly attendance is about 90 people, including children and visitors. Dividing our weekly budget of \$2,744 by 90 people, results in an average giving of \$30.50 per person needed to meet budget. This isn't really a fair representation because no one expects a child or a visitor to contribute \$30.50. Another approach is to consider the average number of offering envelopes received per week. These represent our active members. We receive about 45 envelopes per week. Each

envelope is a member-giving-unit and can represent an individual, husband and wife, or a large family. Dividing our weekly budget of \$2,744 by 45 envelopes, results in an average giving of \$60.98 per envelope needed to meet budget. Again, this approach isn't entirely fair either because it doesn't account for the number of people represented by a single envelope. Neither method takes into account the financial ability of the contributor.

It's always a dilemma to determine a fair method of apportioning our budget among the congregation members. The reality of the situation is that it's your decision of how much to contribute. The statistics given above are only a guide to help you understand where your current level of giving fits into our budget. All we can ask is that you carefully consider your weekly offering and increase your offering so that our budget can be met. We can meet this budget (and exceed it so that we can fund outreach once again). If each of the 90 people in church each week gave only \$3.00 more, we'd meet budget. We can all understand \$3.00. It's not a scary number like \$142,693. All of us can increase our giving, some perhaps not as much as others, but everyone can help.

Please consider your giving. Pray about it. Increase your giving to the best of your ability. No matter what you decide to give, remember that it's only a small fraction of God's gifts to you.

Mark Allen Powell (www.elca.org/stewardship/sermon.asp) has pointed out "that 'the offering may be the most honestly worshipful moment in our weekly worship service. You can't 'go through the motions' when you are making a truly sacrificial gift. The poor will always be with us. Ironically, Jesus so identified himself with the poor, we can best show our gratitude, worship Christ and follow his example when we ourselves give generously and with humility to the poor.'"
