Take a look at our October calendar. It's another busy one! It's always so wonderful to see how God allows the blessed gifts of our congregation to be a home for so many ministries. In addition to the ongoing work of our congregation, we are home to two dance classes and two scout troops as well as our ongoing hosting of the American Red Cross blood drives. God is so good and so alive at Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church!

How about considering joining a Bible study group this month if you haven't already? We have three opportunities right now, and each would be a wonderful way to be busy in God's Word! One meets weekly on Thursdays at 2 p.m., and is currently digging into the Gospel of John. 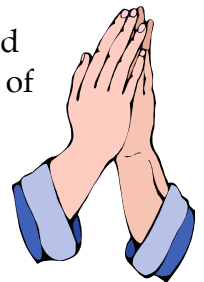

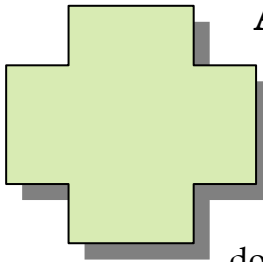


Picnic & Hayride

New Authorized Lay Worship Leader Class Begins

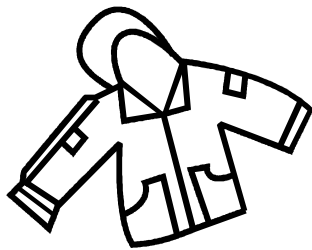

It will soon be time to distribute the many hats, scarves, and mittens that members of our congregation

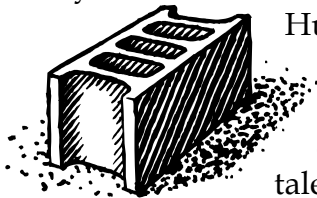
have been diligently knitting and/or crocheting. If you have been making any of these items to donate, please bring them to the Church as soon as possible so they can be included in this year's distribution.

Special Sesame Chicken Salad

(This recipe submitted by Barb Gray was a big hit at the Family Reunion Potluck.)

- 1 pkg. (16 oz.) bow-tie pasta
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 2/3 cup white wine vinegar
- 2/3 cup Teriyaki sauce
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 3 cans (11 oz. each) mandarin oranges, drained
- 2 cans (8 oz. each) sliced water chestnuts, drained
- 2 cups cubed, cooked chicken
- 1-1/3 cups honey roasted peanuts
- 1 pkg. (9 oz.) fresh spinach, torn
- 1 pkg. (6 oz.) dried cranberries
- 6 green onions, chopped
- 1/2 cup minced fresh parsley
- 1/4 cup toasted sesame seeds

Cook pasta according to package directions; drain and place in a very large bowl. In a small bowl, combine the oil, vinegar, teriyaki sauce, sugar and pepper. Pour over pasta and toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate 2 hours. Just before serving, add the remaining ingredients; gently toss to coat. Enjoy!
Serves 22.

Authorized Lay Worship Leader Journey

The beginning of my journey as a future Authorized Lay Worship Leader began on Saturday, September 8, at 8:30 in the morning. My mentor, Pastor Pat, picked me up and we

traveled together. I have to admit that I was nervous (ok, I still am!). When we walked into the Washingtonville Lutheran Church, the first thing that I noticed was how friendly everyone was. Although the only people I really knew were Pastor Pat and Kellie Brouse, I immediately felt at home. I never took an exact count, but I imagine there were 25-30 other potential Worship Leader candidates there.

This first session, the beginning step in my journey was a general orientation in what we were going to learn and what to expect. We began with opening devotions being done by an Authorized Lay Worship Leader who had graduated from a previous class. Then, Pastor Melody Sell gave opening remarks and gave a very comprehensive overview of what we were to expect in our two-year learning adventure. After this, the class played an "introduction game", which allowed us to meet all the participants and get to know a little more about them. I have to admit, it was a great way to meet all the great "students."

After lunch, we had a Bible study, then more information was presented to us about our future classes. At the same time, in a different part of the church, the mentors were also receiving training.

There was so much that went on, and the class had so much energy. I loved it. I can hardly wait until October's session. Since the first session in September, I have met with Pastor Pat to review my homework for October. I am very blessed that she is my mentor and a big part of my support network.

Finally, I need to take this opportunity to thank Church Council and the congregation at Christ Lutheran for your financial and moral support. Your support is appreciated and needed. Stay tuned for future installments, as I will keep everyone informed of my joys and fears in the 2 year journey I have started.
